Open Doors was launched in 1955 by a courageous Christian from the Netherlands named Brother Andrew.

Brother Andrew is best known for his best-selling book God's Smuggler, which tells stories of his secret missions to bring Bibles into communist countries during the height of the Cold War.

Today, Christians continue to be persecuted, and, like Brother Andrew, Open Doors continues to take risks to support and resource these Christians and to strengthen the church.

Open Doors can only do this with your support. Your help enables Open Doors to serve millions of persecuted Christians in more than 70 countries, working with churches and local partners to provide Bibles, Christian materials, training, livelihood skills and advocacy.

Today, increasing numbers of persecuted Christians are looking to their brothers and sisters to walk with them on their journey.

With your prayers and support, they know they are not alone in their suffering, and they are encouraged to continue.

Open Doors vision is that no one suffers persecution alone. When one member of the body suffers, all suffer with it. In 2021, you continued to stand steadfastly with your persecuted family across the world. As persecution intensified, so did your prayer and support, giving them much encouragement and showing them that they are not alone and not forgotten.

In the face of violent persecution and in some cases the threat of death, our brothers and sisters could only hold on to hope and call on their global family to support them in prayer. Where you couldn't go, your prayers went. You were their tangible source of hope. You stood with them and gave them more reason to hold on to faith.

Thanks to your support, our field teams and partners on the ground have continued to defy all odds and persevere in their effort to reach our persecuted family with the help they need. The impact of the Covid 19 pandemic created unique challenges and restricted our work on the ground, but by God's grace, our field teams served 6.2 million beneficiaries, 34% more than was planned for the year.

For your prayer, financial investment, and generous decision to support your persecuted family for the long term, we are immensely grateful. We are one body in Christ and it is only with your support that we can continue to stand with the persecuted.




The global impact


Open Doors Hong Kong impact

Amen.


